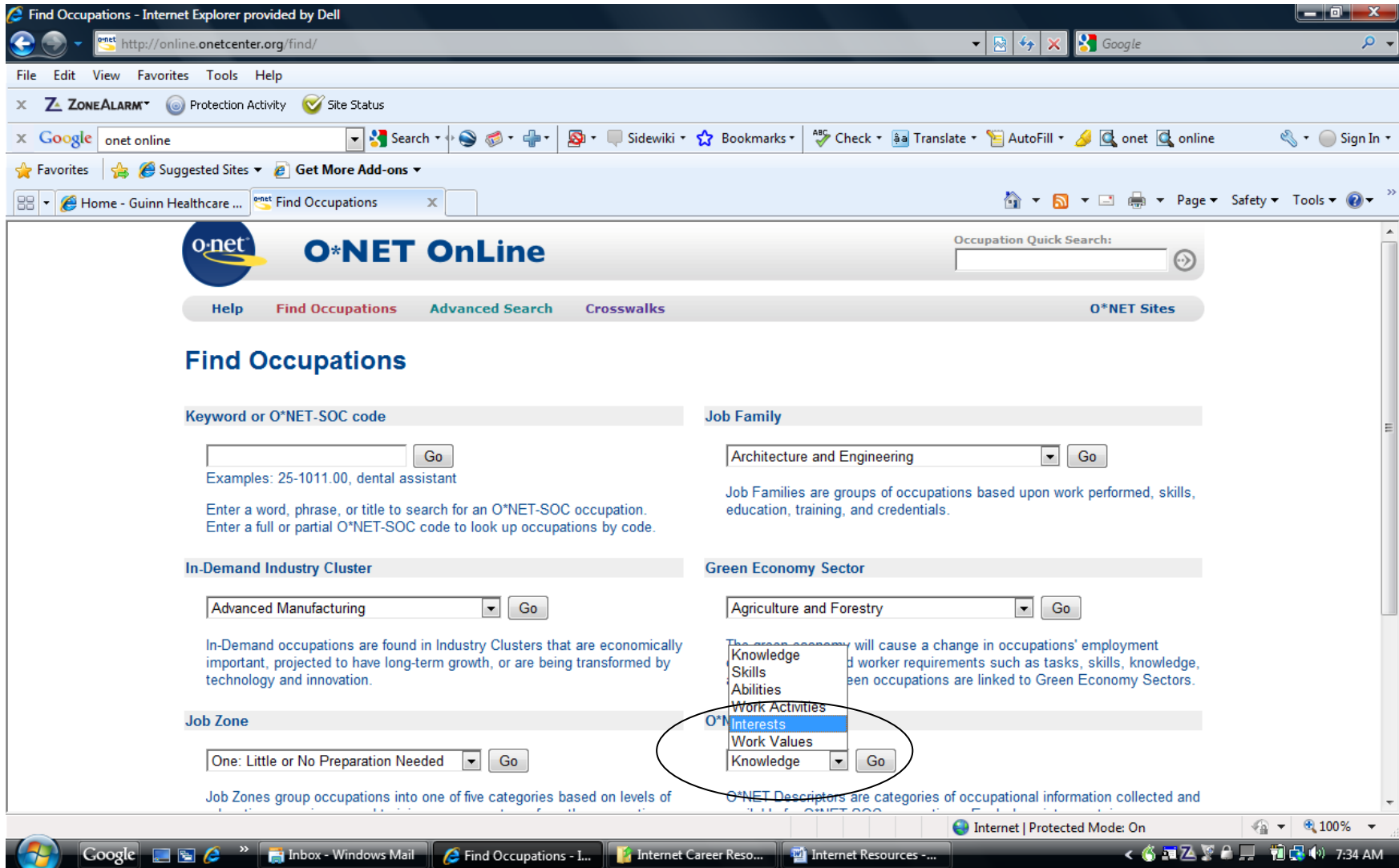

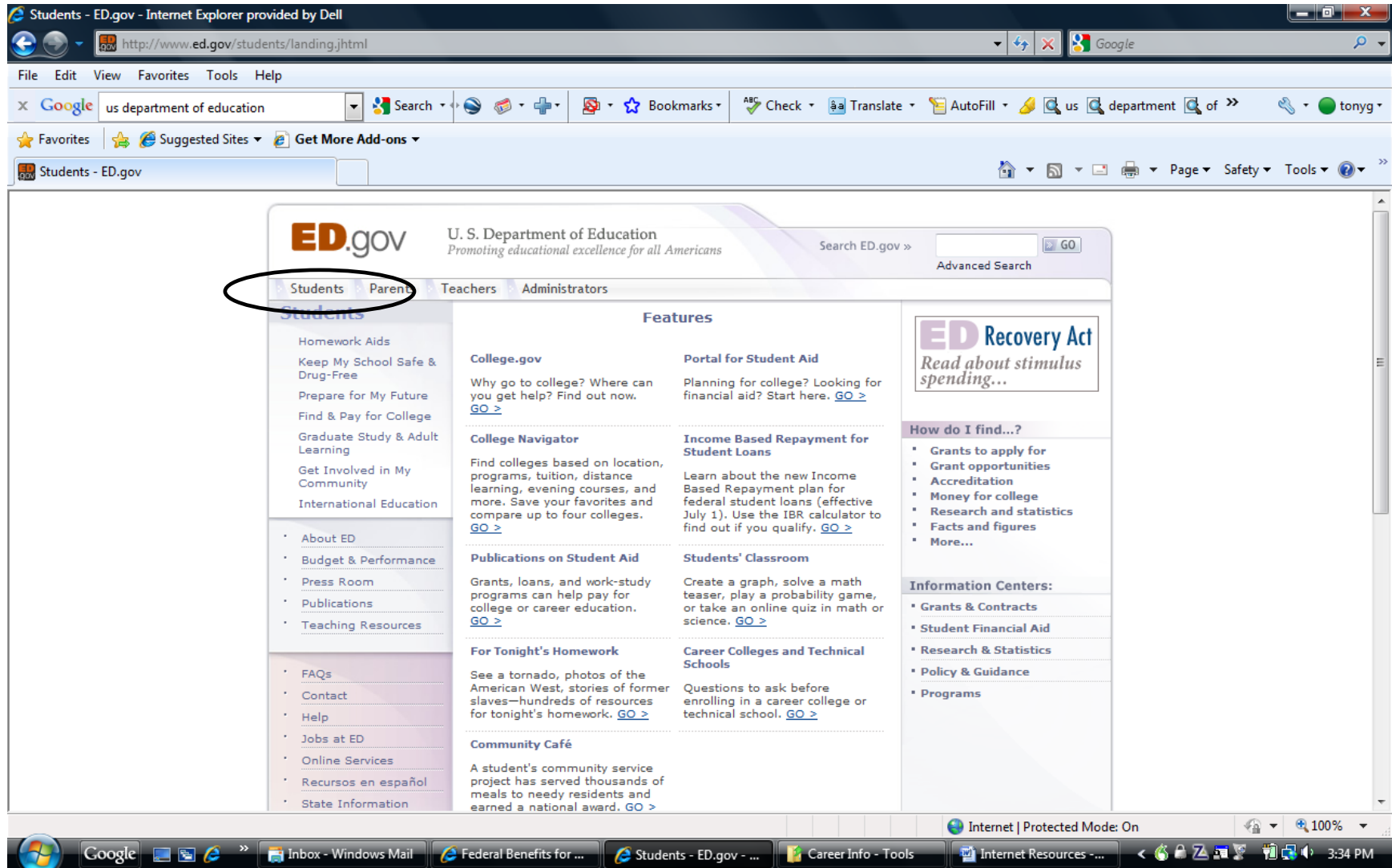

- Your **2008** W-2 Forms and other records of money earned
- Your (and your spouse's, if you are married) **2008** Federal Income Tax Return - IRS Form 1040, 1040A, 1040EZ, 1040TeleFile, foreign tax return, or tax return for Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the U.S. Virgin Islands, the Marshall Islands, or the Federated States of Micronesia. If you have not yet filed a **2008** income tax return, simply provide the income and tax information with your best estimate
- Your parents' **2008** Federal Income Tax Return information (if you are a [dependent student](#))
- Your **2008** untaxed income records - Social Security, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, welfare, or veterans benefits
